| History, music culture and performance | L-ART/07 | Instrument training and interpretation: Piano | Advanced training in the execution and interpretative skills for the repertoire of the 20th and 21st century, through the study of a range of styles and music languages. Analysis of issues related to body/hand movements, to notation and to different aesthetic approaches in contemporary music. |
| History, music culture and performance | L-ART/07 | History-Theory: repertoire/ focus on single composers | Study (involving both execution and historical analysis) of one specific area of the contemporary repertoire (a composer, a style, a composition form). |
| Conservation, appreciation and museography of music heritage | L-ART/07 Musicology and history of music | History and theory of music: music analysis of contemporary repertoire | Study of repertoires adopting an analytical and learning approach in order to understand music structures, composition forms and their historical development. |
| Conservation, appreciation and museography of music heritage | L-ART/07 Musicology and history of music | History of Contemporary Music | Advanced study of the principal contemporary composers and the works they have written for piano or for piano ensembles. |



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| Conservation, appreciation and museography of music heritage | L-ART/07 Musicology and history of music | Chamber music | Study, practice and interpretation of instrumental chamber music. Particular attention to developing the performance techniques and the knowledge of repertoires from different eras including the present day. The study area includes the acquisition of skills such as sight reading and techniques of tuning between the different families of instruments. |
